Revision of the Austrian PEFC system 2022-2024



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1 Introduction

PEFC Austria is responsible for setting standards and managing the Austrian PEFC system. Every 5 years, the standards of PEFC Austria must be revised as part of a large-scale public participation process called system revision, which lasts a maximum of 2 years. The last revision process was completed in May 2017. Recognition by PEFC International (www.pefc.org) took place in March 2018. The 2022-2024 system revision process described in this report officially started on June 1, 2022 with the decision of the PEFC Austria General Assembly to start a normal revision. In May 2024, the revised documents (in English translation) are to be submitted to PEFC International for review and recognition. The revised system documents of the Austrian PEFC system are presented in the next paragraph.

2 Scope

The following system documents were revised as part of the PEFC Austria System Revision 2022-2024:

The following points had to be taken into account:

- Changes to the benchmark standard and the guidelines of PEFC International
- Consideration of stakeholder input by the working group
- Consideration of stakeholder contributions from public consultation

3 Responsibilities

3.1 PEFC Austria General Assembly

The PEFC Austria General Assembly is responsible for the start of the revision and the final approval of the documents. It also sets up the working groups and appoints their members based on nominations from the stakeholder invitation.

3.2 PEFC Austria Office

The office team of PEFC Austria, represented by Managing Director DI Gerhard Pichler, Key Account Manager DI Martin Kubli, Marketing and Communications Manager Astrid Köberl, MA were responsible for publicising the start of the revision, the opportunities for participation, the Public Consultation and the results of the standard revision. The PEFC office was responsible for organising the Stakeholder Mapping, providing information about the start of the revision, sending out invitations to meetings and events, organising the working group meetings, taking the minutes and compiling the draft versions.

3.3 PEFC Austria Consultants

In order to carry out the entire process as professionally and objectively as possible, PEFC Austria called in external consultants. These consultancy services included both preparation for the system revision and support during each individual phase of the revision process. The following consultants were called in, among others:

3.4 PEFC Austria Expert Panel

PEFC Austria has a so-called expert panel at its disposal. This consists of four experienced representatives from the specialist areas of forestry and the environment. The task of the expert panel as part of the system revision was to take a critical look at the preliminary drafts of the standard documents after the public consultation and, if necessary, to make recommendations to the working group for content adaptations. The expert committee currently consists of:

3.5 PEFC Austria System Revision Working Group

The members of the Working Group (WG) were selected and appointed by the PEFC Austria General Assembly in accordance with the criteria from the PEFC standards and process descriptions (PEFC AT PB 4001:2017, PEFC ST 1001:2017). From this group, four further sub-working groups were formed for specific topics (forest, biodiversity, forest contractor certification, carbon credits). The PEFC Austria System Revision Working Group had the responsible task of reviewing the PEFC Austria standards from 2017 in four main working groups and four sub-working groups and critically examining whether they were up to date.

The Agenda 21 criteria (PEFC AT PB 4001:2017, PEFC ST 1001:2017) guarantee that the following groups are evenly distributed:

- Forest Owners
- Business & Industry
- Indigenous People
- Non-Government Organisations
- Scientific & Technological Community
- Workers & Trade Unions

4 Procedure

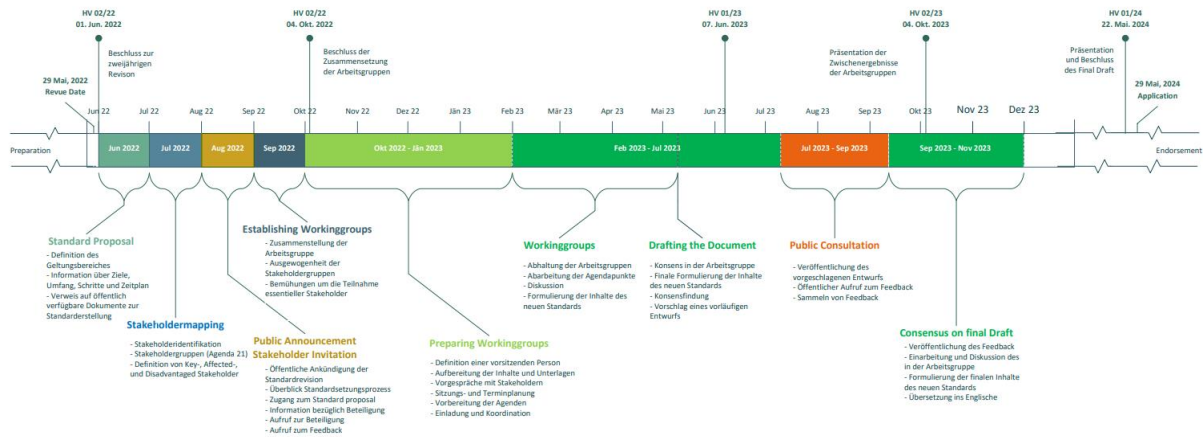
The revision process was carried out in accordance with PEFC AT PB 4001:2017 Standard Setting – Requirements and the international standard PEFC ST 1001:2017 Standard-setting - Requirements. The following points were applied:

- Standard Proposal
- Stakeholder mapping
- Public Announcement & Stakeholder Invitation
- Establishing Workinggroups
- Preparing Workinggroups
- Workinggroups
- Drafting the Document
- Public Consultation
- Consensus on final Draft
- Formal approval of standard
- Publication of standard

All work prior to this is summarized under the preparatory phase.

4.1 Timeline

The timeline shown here illustrates the chronological sequence of the individual stages of the system revision:



4.2 Preparation phase

4.2.1 GAP analysis

The GAP analysis represented the search for gaps between the currently valid standard documents of PEFC International and the currently valid standard documents of PEFC Austria. This service was partially outsourced by PEFC Austria and put out to tender to several engineering firms on 16 December 2021.

On 21.01.2022, the contract was handed over to Mr. Dipl.-Forstwirt (univ.) Horst Gleißner. Mr. Gleißner has extensive qualifications in the forestry and timber industry, as well as certification. He runs the Forestry and certification office Gleißner, is Senior Audit Manager for PEFC SFM and PEFC CoC, as well as Managing Director of HW-Zert.

The GAP analysis was carried out by Mr Gleißner in the period from January to March 2022 and presented to the PEFC Austria Office on 5 April 2022.

The gap analysis resulted in a total of 244 comments across all relevant documents. Many of the comments comprised minor or formal deviations, a few of which are major deviations from the PEFC International benchmark standard.

4.2.2 System revision workshop

In order to best prepare for the system revision process, PEFC Austria was able to draw on the fresh experience of PEFC Netherlands, in the person of Marten de Groot (National Secretary PEFC NL). PEFC Netherlands had just completed its system revision at that time.

The workshop took place from 30 March 2022 - 1 April 2022 in Wageningen in the Netherlands. The participants from PEFC Austria were DI Gerhard Pichler (Managing Director), DI Martin Kubli (Key Account Management), Astrid Köberl, MA (Marketing and Communication) and Ing. Mag. Matthias Granitzer (Consultant).

The workshop provided very valuable insights into the practical process of the revision, as well as the challenges in the areas of: Technical requirements, process, bureaucracy, working groups, public relations, recognition, etc.

4.2.3 System revision website

A dedicated PEFC Austria system revision website was set up as a central platform to share information with the public and promote interaction in connection with the system revision. This was integrated into the PEFC Austria website (www.pefc.at). Both general and specific information on the 2022-2024 System Revision could be found on the website. An explanatory video was also published there to provide low-threshold information.

In addition to providing general information, the website was the central interaction platform, particularly in the Public Announcement & Stakeholder Invitation and Public Consultation phases. The following tasks, among others, were solved via the website:

- **Public Announcement & Stakeholder Invitation**
 - a. Download box for relevant documents
(Standard setting process, Standard proposal: PEC AT System 2024, Timeline PEFC Austria system revision 2022-2024, PEFC-AT-PB-4001 standard setting requirements, PEFC ST 1001_2017 Standard-setting – Requirements)
 - b. Feedback box for feedback on the scope of the standards and the revision process
 - c. Nomination of organisations and individuals for participation in the working group meetings

- **Public Consultation**
 - a. Calls and information for Public Consultation
 - b. Publication and download box of the revised documents
 - c. Feedback tool for feedback on specific standard documents
 - d. Publication of the summary of all comments from feedback providers

4.3 Revision phases

4.3.1 Revue Date

PEFC International specifies a two-year period for the core of the system revision (Standard Proposal - Formal approval of standard). The date for the start of this revision phase (Revue Date) is also specified.

The Revue Date was set for 29 May 2022. This means that the revision process must be completed by 29 May 2024.

4.3.2 Resolution PEFC Austria General Assembly

On 1 June 2022, the PEFC Austria General Assembly in Heiligenblut am Großglockner passed a resolution to launch the 4th system revision of PEFC Austria to revise the standards for sustainable forest management.

4.3.3 Standard Proposal

The scope, objectives, and steps to be included in the revision were defined in the standard proposal. These points were submitted to PEFC International in an official document on 28 June 2022.

4.3.4 Stakeholder Mapping

In Stakeholder Mapping, an analysis was carried out of potential interest or stakeholder groups that can provide relevant input for sustainable forest management in Austria. Stakeholders were identified for the PEFC Austria System Revision 2022 - 2024 as follows:

- Brainstorming of all possible stakeholders of the PEFC Austria revision team (office, consultant, chairman)
- Look for documents from past system revisions
- Research in committees of related organisations (forest dialog, cooperation platforms, environmental organisations, ...)

This Stakeholder Mapping was carried out in July 2022. When selecting the stakeholders, care was taken to create a group that was as balanced as possible. This was done in accordance with the PEFC International Standard PEFC ST 1001:2017, based on the criteria of Agenda 21 of the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) in Rio de Janeiro in 1992, where the following six main stakeholder groups relevant to the forest were defined:

- Forest owners
- Business and industry
- Indigenous people
- Non-government organisations
- Scientific and technological community
- Workers and trade unions

A targeted search was conducted for relevant stakeholders in each of these stakeholder groups. No stakeholders were defined for the group of "Indigenous people", as this categorization is aimed more at the structures in developing countries. The local population in Austria is well represented by various interest groups.

A total of 238 stakeholders were identified as such in this Stakeholder Mapping, which in turn were divided into the categories of Key Stakeholders, Affected Stakeholders and Disadvantaged Stakeholders. Of the 238 stakeholders, a total of 34 were defined as key stakeholders and 204 as affected stakeholders. No Disadvantaged Stakeholders were identified.

A detailed description of the Stakeholder Mapping can be found in the document „Stakeholdermapping und Stakeholderidentification exercise PEFC Austria Systemrevision 2022 – 2024“.

4.3.5 Public Announcement & Stakeholder Invitation

General information on the 2022-2024 System Revision and detailed information on active participation in this process was disseminated to public in the Public Announcement. The opportunities to participate in this phase of the revision process were as follows:

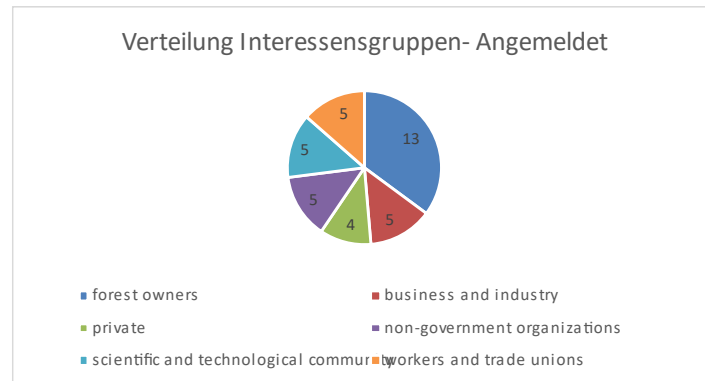
- Nomination of individuals or organisations to participate in the working groups for the 2022-2024 System Revision
- Feedback on the scope of the standards and the revision process

Interested parties had the opportunity to submit feedback or nominations via the relevant tools on the PEFC Austria system review website between 30 August 2022 and 30 September 2022, 11:59 pm.

This information was disseminated via the following channels according to the target group:

- PEFC Austria system revision website as a central interaction platform
- Emails (30/08/2022) to all Key Stakeholders
- Emails (30/08/2022) to all Affected Stakeholders
- Postings via social media (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn)
- PEFC Austria Newsletter (02/09/2022)

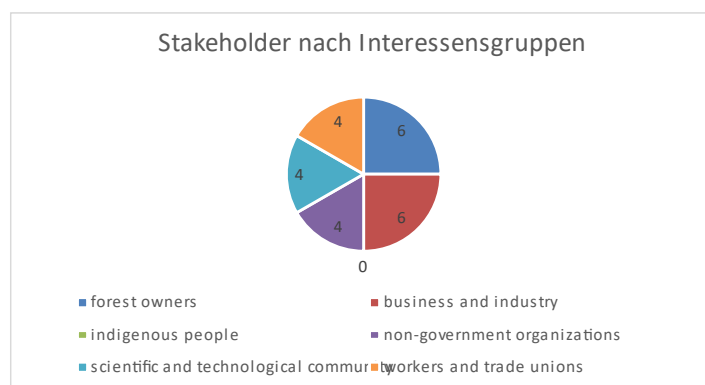
In the 31 days of the Public Announcement & Stakeholder Invitation, there were 37 nominations from interested stakeholders. The following chart shows the breakdown of nominations by interest group, including "private".



4.3.6 Establishing Workinggroups

Based on the nominations, the aim is to create working groups that are as balanced as possible in accordance with the Agenda 21 criteria and the documents PEFC AT PB 4001:2017 Standard Setting – Requirements and PEFC ST 1001:2017 Standard-setting Requirements. The final composition of the working groups was decided by the PEFC Austria General Assembly at the HV 02/22 meeting on October 4, 2022 at the House of Industry in Vienna.

The 24 members of the working group represent the various interest groups, as shown in the following diagram:



This corresponds to the maximum number of participants and the target distribution according to the process description PEFC AT PB 4001 Standard Setting – Requirements. All those who left a nomination on the PEFC Austria system revision website were informed about the respective approval or rejection via e-mail on 17.10.2022.

4.3.7 Preparing Workinggroups

The winter months of 2022/23 were used to prepare for the intensive working group phase and to close the gaps (adjustment to the international benchmark standard).

Based on the GAP analysis previously carried out by Dipl.-Forstwirt (univ.) Horst Gleißner, consultant Ing. Mag. Matthias Granitzer was commissioned to close the gap to the international benchmark standard in the individual system documents. This gap closure was carried out in the period from January to March 2023.

A separate system revision workshop was also held in Vienna from 14-15 December 2022 to prepare for the working group process. The former Managing Director of PEFC Austria, the main person responsible for the 2015-2017 System Revision and certification expert DI Clemens Kraus MSc. was brought in. The consultant for the entire revision, Ing. Mag. Matthias Granitzer, was also present. The kick-off event and the individual working group meetings were planned in detail at the system revision workshop.

The working group members were informed of the planned dates for the working group phase in an initial info mail on 21 December 2022. Detailed information followed on 1 February 2023:

- Information on the kick-off event
- Information on the system revision
- Tasks of the working group members
- Scope of the standards to be revised
- Opportunity to get involved before the working group phase (preliminary discussions)
- (Thematic) flashes at the kick-off event
- Scope of the first working group meeting
- First standard documents with gaps already closed for review

PEFC Austria asked the working group members to disclose topics that are current and relevant to future sustainable forest management. The offer was also made to discuss relevant topics with PEFC Austria in bilateral talks. This offer was also taken up many times. The topics discussed were collected and presented to the other working group members by

the working group members themselves at the kick-off event in so-called flashes. This initial collection of topics was intended to reflect the organizations' current challenges in the context of sustainable forest management and provide a preview of the working group process.

4.3.7.1 Workinggroups

The working group phase began with a kick-off event and a networking evening on 15 March 2023 at the House of Engineers in Vienna. The kick-off event included the following agenda items:

1. Presentation on sustainable forest management in Austria (DI Willibald Ehrenhöfer)
2. Presentation of PEFC Austria (DI Gerhard Pichler)
3. Presentation of the PEFC Austria System Revision 2022-2024 (DI Martin Kubli)
4. Procedure of the working group meetings (Ing. Mag. Matthias Granitzer)
5. Flashes on relevant topics of the stakeholders (working group members)
6. Discussion
7. Outlook

Several presentations on sustainable forest management in Austria in general, on PEFC Austria, on the 2022-2024 system revision and on the course of the subsequent working group meetings were given as an introduction to the working group process. The first collection of topics was presented by the working group members themselves as part of the so-called flashes, with the aim of creating an introduction to the working group process and bringing everyone roughly up to the same level. The first collection of topics consisted of the following presentation points:

- Biodiversity
- Deadwood
- Renewable Energy Directive (RED)
- Deforestation-free supply chains (EUDR)
- Carbon Credits
- Plant protection products
- Forest contractor certification
- Dynamic consideration of forest management

The informal exchange between the working group members was promoted at the networking evening. These kick-off events were communicated to the general public in the form of postings, articles and press releases in various media in order to underpin the relevance of this participation process.

The subsequent working group meetings took place on the following dates:

- Working group meeting 1, 16 March 2023, 09:00 - 13:00, House of Engineers, Vienna
- Working group meeting 2, 13 April 2023, 09:00 - 15:00, Austropapier, Vienna
- Working group meeting 3, 10 May 2023, 09:00 - 15:00, Austrian Chamber of Agriculture, Vienna
- Reserve date, 31.05.2023, 09:00 - 15:00, (did not have to be taken)

In between, specialised sub-working groups took place:

- Sub-working group meeting - Forest, 28 March 2023, 09:00 - 12:00, Austrian Chamber of Agriculture, Vienna
- Sub-working group meeting - Biodiversity, 04.04.2023, 13:00 - 15:00, Online
- Sub-working group meeting - Carbon Credits, 26.04.2023, 13:00 - 16:00, Online

- Sub-working group meeting - Forest contractor certification, 02.05.2023, 13:00 - 16:00, Online

The working groups and sub-working groups were always prepared and followed up by the PEFC Austria system revision team. Invitations were sent in writing by e-mail. All necessary information and documents for the preparation of the working group members were sent in a timely manner.

Ing. Mag. Matthias Granitzer chaired all working group meetings.

In general, the meetings for the working group members were divided into two parts. On the one hand, the review and discussion of the closed gaps (adaptation to the international benchmark standard), and on the other hand, the adaptation of the standard based on the topics of the stakeholders (kick-off event). Here is an example of the agenda for working group meeting 1 (16 March 2023):

2. Adaptation of PEFC AT documents to international benchmark standard
 - PEFC AT 0001:2024 System description PEFC AT

 - PEFC AT PB 4004:2024 Complaint Procedure and Rules of Arbitration
3. Stakeholder topics I
 - Biodiversity
 - Deadwood
 - Renewable Energy Directive (RED)
 - Deforestation-free supply chains (EUDR)
4. Preview of working group meeting 2

This approach meant that the standard (with the exception of the adaptations to the international benchmark standard) was not systematically edited, but rather focused on the content relevant to the stakeholders. The focus of the work was of course on the main document (PEFC AT ST 1001:2024 Standard for Sustainable Forest Management in Austria). Based on this main work, cross-links to the other system documents were then sought and adapted where necessary.

The meetings were characterized by a very open and appreciative discussion culture, all working group members were able to express their opinions freely and all comments were taken into account by the working group. Decisions were always made by consensus. The meetings were recorded in detail, the topics, progress and resolutions can be found in the respective minutes.

The preliminary final 3rd working group meeting was followed by the public consultation and the review by the expert panel. This was followed by the 4th and final working group meeting (see Consensus on final draft).

4.3.7.2 Drafting the Document

On 10 May 2023, the preliminary draft of the revised standards was approved by the working group members at the 3rd working group meeting. These drafts were then corrected by the PEFC Austria revision team for possible errors and put into the correct format.

4.3.7.3 Public Consultation

On 6 July 2023, there was a public call for participation in the 60-day Public Consultation to comment on the draft of the new standards. The Public Consultation started on 10 July and ended on 11 September 2023.

This information was disseminated via the following channels according to the target group:

- PEFC Austria system revision website as a central interaction platform
- Emails (06/07/2023) to the PEFC Austria General Assembly
- Emails (06/07/2023) to the members of the System Revision Working Group
- Emails (06/07/2023) to all Key Stakeholders (Stakeholder Mapping)
- Emails (06/07/2023) to all Affected Stakeholders (Stakeholder Mapping)
- Postings via social media (Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn)
- PEFC Austria Newsletter (07/07/2023)

The PEFC Austria system revision website again functioned as the central interaction platform on which the relevant information, the download box for the draft standards and the tool for submitting feedback were available.

During this 60-day phase, a total of 22 comments were received from two organisations. This feedback was collected via the feedback tool and presented to the PEFC Austria System Revision Working Group members at the 4th working group meeting.

After the 4th working group meeting (see Consensus on final draft), the feedback providers were informed (email) on 22 December 2023 how their feedback had been considered and the summary was made available on the website for public to download.

4.3.7.4 Consensus on final Draft

The feedback from the Public Consultation and the preliminary drafts of the standards were sent to the members of the Expert Panel by email on 19 October 2023. The Expert Panel was tasked with critically assessing both the standards and the feedback and making a recommendation to the System Revision Working Group members.

On 14 November 2023, the feedback from the Public Consultation and the opinion of the Expert Panel were presented to the members of the working group at the 4th working group meeting in Vienna. The respective comments were sufficiently discussed and, if sufficiently relevant, incorporated into the standards and considered. The consideration and comments of the Working Group were also published in the summary of the feedback on the system revision website (Public Consultation Website) on 22 December 2023.

During the meeting, the Working Group adopted the final draft of the standards as a recommendation to the PEFC Austria General Assembly. Finally, the working group phase of the PEFC Austria System Revision 2022-2024 was ended during a networking evening.

After this phase, the revision team checked the documents again for errors, converted them to the correct format and translated them into English. At the same time, work was carried out on the checklist, the summary of changes and this report on the 2022-2024 System Revision.

4.3.8 Formal approval of standard

On May 27, 2024, the PEFC Austria General Assembly approved the proposed final draft of the new system documents. The final system documents of the system revision 2022-2024 must be submitted to PEFC International for recognition by May 29, 2024 at the latest.

4.3.9 Publication of standard

The new system documents were published with the 2022-2024 system revision report on the PEFC Austria website on 28.05.2024. The general public was informed about the update of the PEFC Austria standards via articles in various media.

5 Transition to the revised system documents of PEFC Austria

The PEFC Austria standards enter into force on 27 April 2025, eleven months after their adoption. The procedures for the transition to the revised system documents are described in PEFC AT PB 4007 (Transition to the revised PEFC Austria scheme 2024). The transition period was set at one year (until 27 April 2026).
